#### **Furlough Blessings:**

As we report for the first time in 2019 we look forward to our return this year to Korea. We began with full meetings this year traveling to report to supporting churches while still endeavoring to be in new churches each week. Honestly, we had several meetings in a row that the church wanted a part in reaching souls among the Korean people, but truly felt they couldn't at this time take on any more missionaries.

I am glad to report though in these recent months we have had **7 churched add us to their missions family** for which we are truly grateful.

#### Trip to Korea:

Please pray as I will need to take another trip to Korea. I will go alone to **renew visas** and also look for **housing options**. We have been blessed over the years with housing, but truly desire to purchase a home there. It will be 28 moves in 22 years of marriage this year. It would be nice to not need to move each year.

#### Future ministry outreach

We have had the opportunity for several years to go to Thailand. Korean refugees try to flee there, as they are not sent back if caught. In doing so we have started two churches among the Tribal Lahu and Shan people. They have been gathering and praying weekly for a missionary to come. We may have an American family that has surrendered to go. This is truly a sow-as-you-go blessing from God. They need a Pastor!! Please pray for this.

We will make a trip to this area again in a couple weeks to check on this, but also travel to the Laos Border where there are supposed N. Korean camps full of refugees. We will also try to get into a Thai prison with N. Korean people as well. Please pray as we look into this new church planting option.

We are eager to return to Korea. Our six year old keeps asking when we can go "home." We do thank you all that have been with us for many years and all the new churches that have desired to support our ministry and family.




Now that's truly a blown tire.


