Well, after a super busy last few months, we are finally back in Korea. There's not really anyway to express how many things go into each move between terms on the field. This furlough, we put on nearly 100,000 miles including two trips to Alaska and two trips back to Korea. We worked harder and more efficiently this furlough than even deputation. Raising support and reporting to churches has changed so much even over our short 15 years in ministry. However difficult, God still marvelously blessed.

Several people were saved, many moved to be a part of our ministry and missions as a whole. However, I think more prevalent was the numerous people who specifically sought out deeper missions philosophy. Many times, we found ourselves up late, over coffee, discussing how to better and more efficiently reach the world through the Church-missionary relationship. If I were a writer, I'm sure this gathered knowledge would make for a very insightful little booklet. Who knows??

### Transition

We transitioned back quite smoothly. As usual, some difficulty finding housing. Until we can buy a house, there will be this difficulty and uncertainty. We did find only one house available, so we took it. It has a 6-month lease available only. We will see what will happen when that time comes. It does have a big room that will be suitable to start a church in with an attached restroom. We are grateful for this!

We are still working on processing into Korea with the visa paperwork as well. Ever changing laws now require documentation for things that, in the past, just required checking a box for compliance. We have until February to complete these requirements. We just need to remember that we are a guest in this country.
